Position: Dental Hygienist

Position Summary

The dental hygienist provides preventative and hygiene services as an integral part of the overall treatment plan for a patient as discussed with the dentist to promote and maintain dental and oral health. Responsibilities include contributing to the overall running of the clinic, input into policy/protocol development and helping to maintain all clinic standards. The dental hygienist is accountable to the dental manager.

Responsibilities

- Records and periodically updates patient's medical and dental health histories and alerts as needed.
- Performs periodontal examination and records measurements in periodontal chart and determines the state of periodontal health of each patient.
- Takes digital x-rays.
- Using assessment, plans appropriate periodontal treatment for each patient.
- Explains the recommended treatment to each patient, including time involved, expected outcomes, benefit and possible side effects makes adjustments as required.
- Maintains communication with the dentist with regard to pertinent periodontal-clinical findings and to attain the best results for the patient.
- Provides clinical dental preventative services including: local anesthetic, polishing, topical fluoride application, pit and fissure sealant placement, root planning, scaling and individual oral hygiene instructions.
- Evaluates the success or failure of the treatment plan and makes adjustments as required, with consultation and agreement of the patient and attending dentist.
- Teaches and promotes healthy oral hygiene to patients.
- Adheres to infection control standards and universal precautions at all times.
- Keeps equipment and instruments in good repair and reports equipment problems to the dental manager.

- Creates proper documentation about interactions with patients to facilitate proper follow up among staff and always signs their name after any notes.
- Develops activities and programs for the community as needed.
- Supervises, teaches and coordinates the volunteers/students and new employees when required.
- Contributes to the overall smooth running of the dental clinic.

Contribution to team and centre activities

- Participates actively in staff meetings and board committees.
- Participates in the overall activities of the health centre, e.g. in service training, committees, special events and shared staff responsibilities.
- Communicates clearly, listens accurately, is open to feedback, handles conflict appropriately, and displays sensitivity to others.
- Collaborates well with others, promotes cooperation and teamwork.
- Participates in REACH's commitment to becoming discrimination free and an inclusive health centre and promotes a healthy lifestyle.
- Maintains the reputation and confidentiality of the Health Centre and its patients at all times.
- Adheres to all applicable REACH policies and procedures.

Qualifications

- Is licensed and holds current registration as a Dental Hygienist in British Columbia.
- Practice in accordance with the policies governing the practice of dental hygiene in British Columbia as set out by the College of Dental Hygienists of BC.
- Willing to take initiative and consult with other health care providers inside and outside of the REACH Centre to determine appropriate periodontal treatment
- An understanding of and critical analysis of the determinants of health and social factors, such as power dynamics that affect individual, organizational and community health.
- Excellent communication (oral and written) and interpersonal skills and the ability to multi task in a fast paced environment.
- Ability to work independently and collaborate effectively in a team environment.
- Experience working in a non profit or social services organization an asset.
